## MATERIALS

- Wood carved santa cookie jar  
SKU(DB45762)
- Medium round brush
- Small Round brush
- Liner brush
- Sponge
- Water
- Paint  
13,67,68,90,29,31,29,90

## TIPS

- Wash brushes between coats.
- Allow paint to dry between coats.

## INSTRUCTIONS

Before you begin, wipe a damp sponge over entire bisque to remove dust and contaminants.

1. Apply 1 thick coat of #13 all over the outside of the cookie jar until no white is showing.
2. When the color has lost its shine, take a slightly damp sponge and gently wipe the color off the pottery. You want to wipe lightly, removing the color from just the raised parts of the texture. This will leave the color in just the cracks, giving it an antiqued look. For best results, continually rinse your sponge in your water bowl while you wipe, as needed, and squeeze out the water well so it doesn't drip onto your pottery.
3. Paint 2 washy coats of #67 on the hat fur, eyebrows, hair, beard, and eyes.
4. Paint 2 washy coats of #68 on the face and lip.
5. Paint 2 washy coats of #90 on the hat and holly berries.
6. Paint 2 washy coats of #29 on the holly leaves.
7. Apply 2 coats of #31 for the eye pupils.
8. Paint 1 coat of #29 on the inside.
9. With the end of the paint brush handle, add #90 dots for eye shine on the right side of each eye.
